# The what is Entertainment Question?

- ‘the cry of a tomcat – lights going out and a kick in the balls - That’s Entertainment’ – (That’s Entertainment; The Jam (1980))
- DCMS propose wide scale deregulation of Entertainment for up to 5000.
- Do the police support deregulation.
- What is the regulation for?
- a properly controlled risk management system
- ‘An amateur band rehearsing in a nearby yard’ (That’s Entertainment; The Jam (1980))

# Early Morning Restriction Orders (EMRO) and Late Night Levy!

- EMRO prohibition of the sale of alcohol between midnight and 6am
- Late Night Levy – Levy within a local authority area between midnight and 6am
- 70% police 30% local authority
- EMROs v Late night levy : Both tackle problem of alcohol related harms in the night time economy, different approach.
- The cost is currently borne by police and local authorities

# The future

- ACPO will continue to provide specialist support to police services nationally.
- Local police forces will continue to go through severe financial cuts
- Partnership working will only be effective with buy in by all parties
- The safety of the public will continue to be a driver for the alcohol harms and licensing group
